
Observing a Good Lent

Observing a good Lent means many things. During the season that begins with the Imposition of Ashes we give ourselves time to repent, reflect on scriptures, worship, pray, fast, and give alms. As mentioned a few weeks ago in worship, fasting may include turning away from cynicism or hatred. These days limiting time on electronic devices can be a form of fasting that helps us devote time to other life-giving practices to enhance faith. Through penance and prayer, we are given an opportunity to put aside our sins and failures enabling us to move forward in God's grace. All of these actions are intended to deepen our understanding of God's redemptive acts. Listed below are several ways to assist you in observing a good Lent. As a community of faith, we can support one another in this time of renewal.

- Lenten Devotional materials are available on the table immediately outside the Sanctuary doors. Feel free to pick up your copy today. Wendell Berry is an American novelist, poet, essayist, environmental activist, and farmer from Port Royal, Kentucky.
- There are two opportunities for worship each Wednesday.
 - 12 Noon Community Service at Best Grove Missionary Baptist Church, 1065 Tommy's Road. A light fellowship lunch is provided.
 - 6:15 pm Dinner at GSLC and worship at 7:00 pm. The theme is At the Name of Jesus. Various Lutheran pastors will lead the services.
- Holy Week offers an opportunity to intensify our understanding through drama and proclamation of the Lord's passion and death to awaken in us the power of the cross and resurrection.
 - Palm Sunday-Passion Reading of the Gospel of Matthew
 - Service of Healing on Holy Wednesday, 7 pm
 - Maundy Thursday, 7 pm
 - Good Friday, 7 pm
 - First Service of Easter, April 12, 7 am
 - Easter Breakfast served by LMM
 - Easter 10 am
- Guided Meditation at the NC Museum of Art on Thursday, April 2. We'll arrive at the museum at 11:30 am to have lunch at the Iris Cafe. At 1 pm we will meet a docent who will take us a brief tour. Then for 20-30 minutes we'll wonder in the main gallery and each participant will select a painting or sculpture that says something to them about God or their relationship with God. The group will go back to each one so we can briefly share about that piece of art. Plan on spending the day in this lovely setting with friends from GSLC and Pastor Liz Houndzel's UMC churches. The group size is limited to 10, four from each church. If there is an overwhelming number we will see if we can change our reservation. We will carpool—it will be about \$20 for lunch plus a tip for the docent.

I invite you to create time in your daily schedule to hear the call of God to observe a holy Lent.


