

She now knows most of the members of the church. She remembers their birthdays, anniversaries, and other important happenings in their lives. She calls many regularly to share in their joys and their misgivings. She again celebrates the gift of her life and the gift of her ability in conversation. Many in the parish know that she is "wonderfully made."

Remember you are a gift from God. God has placed you on the earth and given you all that makes you a person. Even your history is a part of what has shaped you—as God says, "wonderful are your works."

During this time when we are not sure how to respond to the world around us or what gifts we have or what we need to acquire to face new demands, let's help each other remember we are wonderfully made as children of God.

Laundry Love

Early in 2020, the Evangelism and Outreach chairs at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church in Goldsboro, North Carolina read an article in Living Lutheran that discussed offering laundry services for low- and no-income community members. Intrigued by this idea, Sue Peacock and Lisa Douglas asked around Goldsboro, NC., and found out that there was already a faith-based group doing just that.

Laundry Love of Goldsboro is a non-profit group that holds a "wash" event at several local laundromats. They provide all the needed supplies and money to wash and dry laundry for any client who needs it, with no income screening. Many of their clients are homeless.

Pre-COVID, they offered an open-door night once per month. Post-COVID, they have moved to an appointment only model, with less clients, but offered every Monday night. Laundry Love is sponsored and supported by several area churches. Sue and Lisa had reached out to their director and made initial contact about becoming involved. Before this could be brought before the Council, COVID hit.

A few weeks later, Laundry Love sent an email requesting any help that Good Sheppard could provide. A drive-by no contact drive for donations of food, water, clothing and bedding, money, and supplies was held on June 13. A large amount of supplies, clothing, and food and hygiene bags were prepared and delivered to the event that next Monday. In late June, they asked if we could bring them more bleach. A second drive was held on Sat July 18th. At that time, we collected about 15 containers of bleach and packaged 48 one-gallon bags of water and snacks. We have also raised over \$250 in cash donations.

During this time of social distancing, this has been a wonderful way for our church to directly support the most vulnerable in our community while following all safety recommendations.
